2 Timothy 3, part 2 (10-14)

Paul appeals to his own life and teachings

- I. The contrast was significant between what Timothy had seen from Paul and what the false teachers were teaching (10).
 - A. "But thou hast fully known...," (we will see that Paul will touch on nine facets of his personal conduct and teaching).
 - 1. "My doctrine" was something Timothy knew well.
 - 2. "Manner of life" or the way he lived day by day.
 - 3. "Purpose" a reference to Paul's unending devotion to spreading the gospel.
 - 4. "Faith' probably a reference to Paul's faithfulness.
 - 5. "Longsuffering" patience in regard to people doing us wrong.
 - 6. "Charity" this is agape, the highest form of love.
 - 7. "Patience" a calm demeanor.
 - 8. "Persecutions" (vs 11).
 - 9. "Afflictions" pain and suffering.
 - B. "Which came unto me at Antioch, at Iconium, at Lystra;" (11).
- II. Verses 12-14 is a sobering passage of scripture.
 - A. Inspiration reveals the universality of suffering as saints (12).
 - B. Evil was not about to vacate the world (13).
 - C. Paul calls on Timothy to make sure he lives differently than the seducers (14).
